3. Not keeping your site updated.

Outdated plugins are one of the top ways sites get hacked.



4. Using too many plugins.

Generally speaking, fewer is better.

But there is no magic number here.

5. Using plugins.

**Quality is more important
than quantity.**

Coding quality and size are important.

6. Keeping unused plugins & themes.

Keep a clean house!



7. Editing a parent theme.

8. Not understanding the difference between themes & plugins.

**Themes are for design and layout.
Plugins are for functionality.**

9. Not using strong, unique passwords.

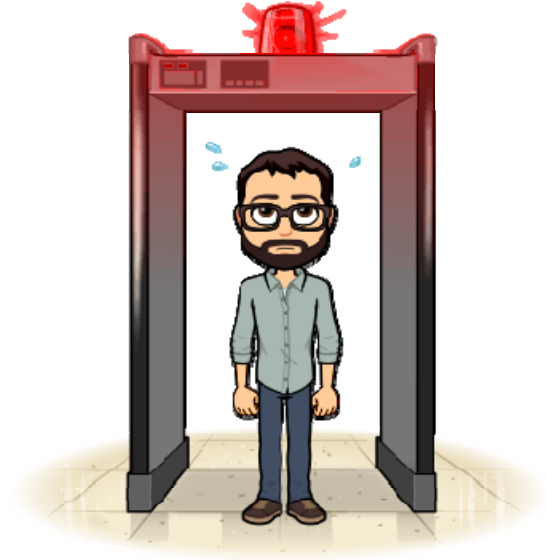
Use a password manager. *Please.*

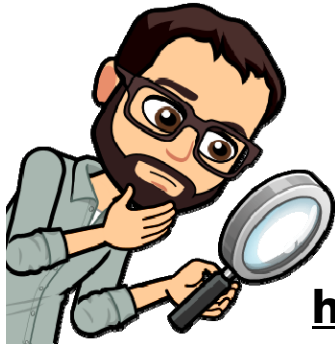

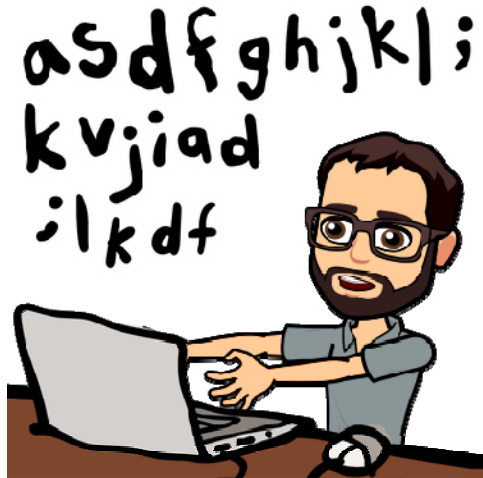

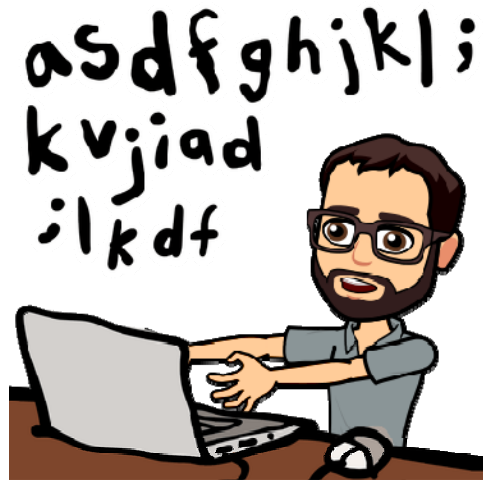
How a user visits our sites:

It's twice as fast as PHP 5.6!!

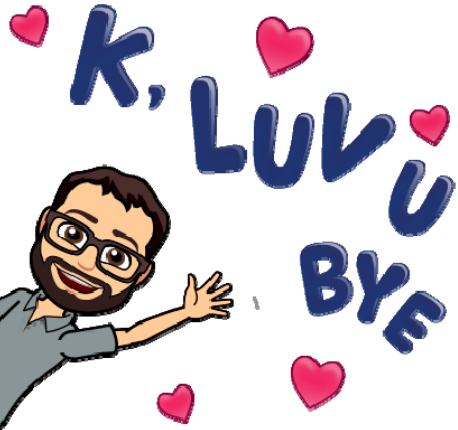
